



NOTE.
 The Rio del Norte, Grande or Bravo runs a course of some 1900 miles in length, it has been ascended by Steam Boats to Laredo upwards of 200 miles from its mouth, and may be ascended by Steam Boats of light draught 600 miles farther, for at least one half of the year.
 If this river should ever become the western boundary of TEXAS (as desired by its inhabitants,) it will add 100 miles to its sea coast and 50,000 square miles to its superficies - the southern section of their surface, sandy barren prairie almost destitute of water; and its northern, rocky sterile mountains nearly as devoid of timber.
